Family Services Hosts Care Camp

First Call's family services started Care Camp over five years ago, and continues to help children gain a healthy, productive lifestyle by unpacking the impact of substance use in the family with education, resilience and safety. This year's camp was offered through both a morning and evening session for better flexibility.

"The camp gives us an opportunity to reach youth that may be otherwise too busy to commit to seven separate sessions. It speaks to our goal of being as accessible to those in need of our services as possible," Family Services Counselor Bethany DePugh said.

The kids will work through Caring for Kids curriculum, learn tools for coping, safety plans and words for feeling they may not have been able to name before, while in an environment with their peers and with the support of First Call counselors. While children growing up in alcohol or drug-affected homes have a higher risk of developing substance use disorder themselves, DePugh wants them to know they are not alone.

"I hope they know they are not alone. I hope they know that there is recovery for them even if there isn't recovery just yet or maybe ever for their loved ones. I hope they know that there are resources available to them," DePugh said. "Growing up as a child in these situations I know how detrimental that it and I know what its like when you don't have that."




